## Project Overview:

The AEQUALIS4TCLF project supports the implementation of the TCLF Pact for Skills, tackling the growing skills gap in the Textile, Clothing, Leather, and Footwear (TCLF) sectors across seven European countries: Czechia, Croatia, Lithuania, Finland, Netherlands, Slovenia, and Serbia. The project aims to promote green and digital transformation, enhancing workforce readiness to ensure that the TCLF industries remain competitive and sustainable.

### **Key Objectives:**

**Address the skills gap** in the TCLF sectors by identifying critical green and digital skills.

**Develop and implement vocational curricula** and learning materials focused on sustainability, digitalisation, and innovation.

**Establish public-private partnerships** to align industry needs with educational offerings, ensuring collaboration between academia and industry.

**Support the long-term competitiveness** and resilience of the TCLF industries by fostering a skilled workforce.

**Promote social inclusion and equality**, ensuring that underrepresented groups are empowered, aligning with the EU's priorities for the green and digital transitions.



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#### Main activities:

**WP2 – Stakeholder & Regional Engagement:** Build partnerships across Europe with companies, VET providers, and regional authorities to form regional and national TCLF Skills Partnerships within the TCLF Pact for Skills.

**WP3 – Skills Needs & Gap Analysis:** Assess and identify critical green and digital skills for the TCLF sectors to update the TCLF Skills Strategy based on current needs.

**WP4 – Curriculum Development:** Develop modular curricula for key roles in the TCLF sector, ensuring alignment with sustainability and digitalisation requirements, while employing micro-credentials to enable flexible, accessible learning pathways.

**WP8 – Diversity, Innovation & Well-being:** Host workshops and webinars on diversity and well-being, develop a TCLF diversity manifesto, and promote best practices for inclusivity in the industry.

#### **Expected Impacts**

Short-Term: Greater access to TCLF training aligned with industry needs and stronger educationalindustry collaboration.

Medium-Term: Enhanced vocational training quality, improved job prospects, and increased social inclusion in the TCLF sectors.
